

WH Questions

Wh-words are *what*, *when*, *where*, *who*, *whom*, *which*, *whose*, *why* and can include *how*. We use them to <u>ask for specific information</u>. We do not give a *yes-no* answer to a Wh-question.

Verbs

When a word describes an action, an event, or a state, it is called a <u>verb</u>. Most verbs are called "regular verbs" because their forms for past simple, and past participle follow the same pattern or structure. You can recognize a regular verb because its past simple and past participle forms end in 'ed'.

The verbs that do not have the same pattern or structure in simple past and past participle are called "irregular verbs." You can recognize them because their forms do not have 'ed'; their forms change in these tenses. (You can find the list of irregular verbs in the middle section of your dictionary).


You can find in **Appendix 1** a list of the 20 most common irregular verbs.




Can - Cannot/Can't


